Friday, February 3rd: Office Day – in office working on scheduling/calendars/budget if you need a ride to appointments etc please contact me at the office or let me know ahead of time.

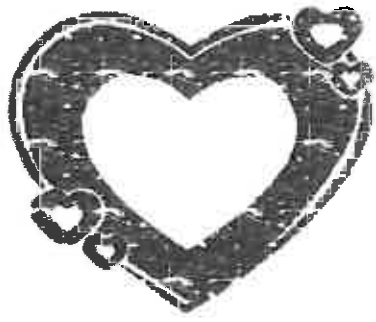

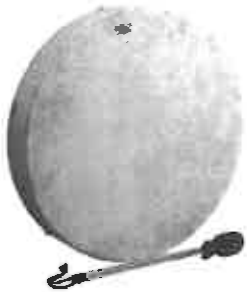

A Strong Caution to Community Members

Many of us may have heard the recent reports in the media regarding the recent deaths from the use of Ecstasy. The reports have confirmed that a “bad batch” of Ecstasy is currently being distributed in the Lower mainland. Although it has yet to be confirmed, it is expected that these drugs could reach our communities. Parents, Guardians, our Youth and Community Members in general are asked to be extra careful due to these recent reports. Although there is never a good time to use hard drugs such as these, we urge extra special attention regarding Ecstasy due to the unpredictable nature of the batch currently in circulation. Below is further information about the alert and some helpful tips should it be helpful.

Should I worry about Ecstasy?

Yes! Here’s the latest on “E” in BC:

1. **If you took “E” and feel sick or overheated, don’t wait! Go to a hospital.** By the time some people got there, it was too late and they died. (You won’t get arrested!)
2. **“E” is almost ALWAYS a combo drug.** You never know what’s in it. One tab tested had: MDMA (Ecstasy), meth, coke, ketamine, DMP, and TFMPP (“Legal X”). **PMMA is in “E” too, and it may have been there a while.**
3. **PMMA (a toxic meth chemical) has been found in people who died taking so-called “E”.** Even by itself, “E” can cause dangerous body overheating. Overheating can cause seizures, brain damage, or death. **PMMA can block the “E” high so people take more and overheat more easily.**
E + PMMA = more toxic
4. **Even 1 or 2 tabs can be a problem.** Some people’s bodies just can’t handle even one tab. Taking several tabs at once or over a few hours can really be bad.
5. **Using other drugs** (booze, prescription or street) at the same time **makes toxic effects worse.**
6. **If you take “E”, always have someone sober with you** to take you to hospital **right away** if you get sick or overheat.
7. **Best idea? Don’t do “E”, especially right now. Remember, you never know what you are really taking.**

General Signs of Ecstasy Use:

What to Look for:

- Hyper-Alertness
- Sweating
- Dry mouth (thirsty)
- Increased heart rate
- Fatigue
- Jaw-clenching/Sore Jaw/Teeth Grinding
- Hyperthermia (cold when they should not be)
- Agitation
- Increased emotional responses (more empathetic than individual would normally be)
