Special Education Coaching Consultant

Short term funding has become available for Special Education Coaching consultants. The positions are term until March 31, 2012. The positions will be under the Direction of FNESC Special Education staff, and will report to the Specialist of Instructional Services FNESC.

The Coaches will be required to support FNESC Special Education initiatives, for example DIBELS training or instructional coaching. Coaches will be required to travel to First Nations schools across BC to offer direct training and support.

Requirements:

The position will require an individual with the following knowledge, skills and personal characteristics:

Educational and Experience Requirements

- A Degree in Education, Adult or Special Education.
- Minimum of 5 years' experience with special needs education;
- Minimum of 2 years' experience in the provision of direct service in First Nations education system and understanding of First Nations issues in British Columbia;
- An equivalent combination of education, training and experience;
- Valid driver's license and a satisfactory criminal records check;
- Computer literacy (Word, PowerPoint, Excel, etc.)

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

- A comprehensive understanding of First Nations education issues and First Nations issues in British Columbia. Knowledge of current trends, issues, best practices, philosophy and techniques in special education;
- Advanced critical thinking, organizational and problem solving skills;
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills and abilities to discuss special education services;
- Ability to establish and maintain relationships; and collaborate and advocate effectively with internal stakeholder;
- Ability to align special education goals with the FNESC strategic goals and objectives;
- Ability to function effectively as part of a team.

REMINDER

TO ALL MEMBERS RE: ANIMAL CONTROL CONCERNS

We have an Animal Control by-law in place for the Reserve lands, but we have not had an enforcement mechanism to this date. Unfortunately, the number of complaints of stray dogs being a nuisance by barking and leaving feces on other people's property has increased in the past few months. I have spoken directly with some of the owners but, again, this appears to have had no impact.

The Band office has been in discussion with the City of Campbell River and the local S.P.C.A. to arrange for enforcement of the by-law and that matter should be resolved in the very near future. In the meantime, due to the lack of response from owners who let their dogs run astray, we will take steps to respond to stray dog complaints by picking them up and taking them to the S.P.C.A. shelter. In order to retrieve a dog from the shelter, the owner will have to pay all of the applicable fees.

Stray dogs will be picked up by Band staff and taken to the local S.P.C.A.

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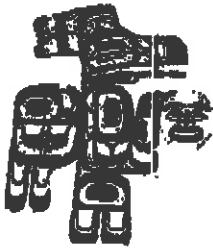
